#### Important facts to know about driving a car in the United States:

**You must have United States** *Driver's License*- you must pass a written test on driving laws in the United States in English and a driving test.





The place where you apply for a driver's license and take the tests is:

Colorado Division of Motor Vehicles

\*\*\*You MUST have car insurance to legally drive in the United States\*\*\*

#### Do you want to buy a car?

When you buy a car it is important to look at many different car dealers or in the "classified" section of the Fort Collins newspaper. You must have a United States driver's license and car insurance.

#### Do you want to rent a car?

When you rent a car you must have a United States driver's license and a **credit card**. Come to the INTO CSU Center for more information on how to rent a car in Fort Collins.

#### Legally: according to the law

**Drivers License:** official card that says you are legally allowed to drive **Car insurance:** an arrangement with a company in which you pay them money, and they pay the costs if your car is damaged.

Many people ride bicycles in Fort Collins!

#### Important facts to know about riding bicycles in Fort Collins:

- Ouse the correct hand signals
- Ride your bike on the RIGHT side of the road.
- Use the **turning lane** to turn.
- People who are walking have the right of way.
- ♦ Always wear a **helmet.**

**Use a** *bike lock*– Use a bike lock so that no one **steals** your bicycle. You can buy a bike lock at the bookstore, in the Lory Student Center or in any bike shop in Fort Collins.

### Register your bicycle with the CSU Campus Police- You pay

Monday - Friday 8:00 am - 5:00 pm

Turning lane: traffic lane where cars and bicycles turn right or left **Register:** put your name on an official list **Right of way:** the right to go first or in front of other people **Steal:** to take something that belongs to someone else



Bus Map- See a map where all the buses go in Fort Collins.


**Bus schedules and routes-** Find out which bus you need and what time it leaves.

#### Should I go to the Emergency Room or the doctor?

In the United States, the emergency room can be very expensive, crowded, and doctors only treat the most serious emergencies first. If you are sick or have a small problem, the Emergency Room is not a good choice. Instead, go to an **urgent care** on weekends. To find the nearest urgent care center, look in your phone book or on the internet.

#### **Health Insurance**

All students must have CSU approved health insurance. You can buy health insurance at the INTO office. Health insurance will help you pay for all medical bills.


#### Immunizations

If you don't feel safe walking on campus at night, a Campus Service Officer walks with you. (CFOs) are students who work for the CSU Police. The Safe Walk Program is **free** to all CSU students.

**Crime**– an action that is wrong or can be punished by the law: stealing is a crime

Lock out – close a place to stop someone from getting in: I lost my key. I am locked out

Meal Plans: Go to the Palmer Center to buy a meal plan.

**On– campus students:** If you live the dormitories, you can use your RamCard to buy food in the dining halls.

**Off-campus students:** If you don't live in the dormitories, you can purchase a meal plan or pay with money to buy food at the dining halls.

1. **Register your bike-** All bicycles on campus must be registered. It costs \$10. Take your bike to the bike and traffic office. Bring the serial number of your bike.

2. **Pay or appeal your tickets**- you have 14 days to pay or appeal tickets. You can pay your tickets in office or by mail. If you do not pay your ticket, the fine will double (you will have to pay 2x the original amount.)

3. **Impounded Bikes**– If your bike is not where you left it, contact the bike and traffic office.

**4. Bike Lock Cut**– If you need your bike lock cut, call for an appointment. It costs \$5.

**5. Bicycle Fix-it Station**– get your bike fixed for free every Wednesday from 11:00am-1:00pm at the Fix-it Station on the south-west side of CSUPD. *Cost: FREE*
